At approximately 1930. I and other Officers were assigned to monitor and control crowds on the 400 block of Olive. While monitoring the crowd, we heard shouting that Officers were taking incoming projectiles. I heard bottles breaking and saw bottles, rocks and fireworks being thrown into the Officers from the crowd of Anarchists. I saw a brown baseball sized rock land approximately five to ten feet from my position holding a line with other Officers. I saw a W/M later I'd as A/Irwin-Patterson, wearing a Black t-shirt, black jeans and a dark bandana covering his face, rush forward and grab the rock. A/Irwin-Patterson grabbed the rock and immediately reared back with the rock in his right hand in preparation for throwing the rock. It appeared as though A/Irwin-Patterson was fully committed to throwing the rock as his right foot was back, his left foot forward and his right arm fully cocked back. A/Irwin/Patterson was directly facing me and several other Officer when he was preparing to throw the rock. I was preparing for taking an impact from a rock at short distance. I and at least two (2) other Officers saw A/Irwin-Patterson about to throw the rock at us and we immediately yelled "he has a rock!" or words to that effect, while pointing at A/Irwin-Patterson.

A/Irwin-Patterson noticed that several Officers pointing and yelling at him and he put the baseball sized rock into his right pant pocket. A/Irwin-Patterson still had the dark colored bandana covering the lower part of his face. A/Irwin-Patterson brought his hands above his head and showed us his palms, showing us he had nothing in his hands. A/Irwin-Patterson then ducked down and attempted to back into the crowd. I and several other Officers went towards A/Irwin-Patterson to arrest him. As we approached, A/Irwin-Patterson reached into his right pant pocket and removed the rock and dropped it on the ground. Another Officer picked up the rock. I took hold of A/Irwin-Patterson's t-shirt and pulled him out of the crowd. I then passed A/Irwin-Patterson off to other Officers who took him into custody.

Sgt Umporowicz screened the arrest. A/Irwin-Patterson was transported to the West Precinct and then transported to KCJ where he was booked for Investigation of Assault.

That Russ Weklych is a Detective with the Seattle Police Department and has reviewed the investigation conducted in Seattle Police Department Case Number 2013-146061;

There is probable cause to believe that Joshua R Patterson 8-3-1994 committed the crime (s) of Assault and Riot.

This belief is predicated on the following facts and circumstances:

That on May 1 2013 Officers J Briskey, S Knapp and A Clinton were assigned to work the "May Day" demonstrations in the downtown core area of the City of Seattle, County of King in the State of Washington. All Officers were wearing uniforms/clothing/equipment clearly identifying them as Police Officers for the City of Seattle. These Officers were part of a larger contingent of dozens of Officers assigned to demonstration management of the large crowds of hundreds in the area. Some groups within these crowds were engaged in violent roving actions on the streets at the time of this incident.

At approximately 2020 hours Officers were following/moving the large hostile crowds on Olive Way. Officers came under attack from some members of the masked and hooded crowd who were throwing baseball and football size rocks along with bottles and other objects. Officer Briskey observed a large baseball size rock impact the pavement approximately ten feet from him; Officer Clinton also made this same observation. Both Officers Briskey and Clinton then observed a male dressed in a black bandanna, black tee shirt and black pants, later identified as suspect Joshua R Patterson, advance from the crowd and pick up the same rock described above from the ground. Both Officers observed Patterson take an aggressive stance with his left foot forward and crouching slightly; the rock in his right hand cocking his right arm back in a classic position of a baseball player throwing a ball. The Officers observed Patterson's stance and actions were facing in the direction of, and directed at, the uniformed Police Officers. Officers Briskey and Clinton felt immediate fear Patterson readying and in process to throw the rock at Police Officers; Officer Clinton yelled a warning to Officers and pointed his baton at suspect Joshua Patterson. Officer Briskey noted Patterson was looking directly at him as Patterson maintained the position of the throwing stance with the arm cocked back and the rock in his hand.

At the point Officer Clinton yelled the warning and pointed his baton at Patterson both Officers Briskey and Clinton observed Patterson become aware of Officers attention directed at him and quickly put the rock in his pants pocket. Patterson then attempted to "blend" and assimilate back into the crowd however Officers were able to advance quickly toward him. As Officers approached Patterson Officers Clinton and Briskey observed Patterson withdraw the rock from his pocket and drop it to the pavement. Patterson then thrust both hands above his head into the air. Patterson was handcuffed and taken into custody. Officer Clinton recovered the rock and gave it to Officer Briskey who later submitted it to Seattle Police Department evidence.





Over a period of thirty minutes, Detective Tomlinson#5913 observed DAVIS throwing objects into the line of uniformed police officers.

At approximately 2015 hours KC Detective Johnson, on three occasions, observed DAVIS throw a large rocks into the line of uniformed officers. Det. Johnson observed one of these rocks strike SPD uniformed officer, later identified as Michele GALLEGOS#6765. Officer GALLEGOS sustained an injury after being struck in the left leg by this rock. The rock was recovered and retained as evidence.

At approximately 2030 hours, Detectives observed DAVIS separating from the crowd and walking away. Detectives approached DAVIS with the purpose of arresting him. DAVIS observed the Detectives and began running away east on Olive Way. Detectives caught DAVIS after a short foot pursuit.



This belief is predicated on the following facts and circumstances:

On May 1, 2013 at approximately 2000 hours, Seattle Police Detectives Sicillia, Gonzales and Tomlinson and King County Detective Steve Johnson #72866 were monitoring a large crowd of approximately 300 people in the 500 block of Olive Way, which is located in the City of Seattle, County of King and State of Washington.

This crowd was gathered related to the May Day demonstration. During this demonstration, the crowd became hostile during the demonstration and began throwing rocks and bottles into the line of uniform officers who were trying to manage the large crowd.

Detectives observed a black male adult, later identified as Marcel Davis, in the crowd. Davis was passing large rocks to several of the demonstrators. Detectives also noticed that Davis was holding onto a large (softball size) rock in his right hand. Photos of Davis holding the rock were obtained.

At approximately 2015 hours, King County Detective Johnson, on three occasions, observed suspect Davis throw large rocks into the line of uniform officers. Det. Johnson observed one of these rocks (thrown by Davis) strike Officer M. Gallegos #6765 in the leg. After being struck in the leg/knee, Officer Gallegos felt intense pain to her knee and could not put weight on her leg. Officer Gallegos needed assistance from another officer to get cover in the transport van. Officer Gallegos sustained an abrasion, swelling and pain to her knee. On May 2, 2013 Officer Gallegos sought medical attention at her primary care physician and was diagnosed with a cracked patella of the knee.

At approximately 2030 hours, Detectives observed suspect Davis separating from the crowd and they attempted to approach him with the intention of arresting him for the assault. Davis observed the Detectives approaching and began to run east on Olive Way. Detectives caught him after a short foot pursuit.

According to NCIC/Triple I, Marcel L. Davis has been convicted of a gross misdemeanor 12/2011 and 1 charge, classification unknown (criminal solicitation) 3/2013.

8 REQUEST FOR BAIL

9 Pursuant to CrR 2.2(b)(2)(ii), the State requests that a warrant in the amount of \$60,000
10 because of the likelihood that the defendant will commit a violent offense. The defendant's
11 criminal history includes convictions for: Solicitation to Commit a Violation of the Uniform
12 Controlled Substances Act (2012); and, Assault (2011).

13 In this case, the defendant was part of an unruly mob that began rioting during the May
14 Day protests. Prior to the assault that gives rise to this matter, the defendant distinctly stood out
15 to law enforcement officers because he was handing softball-sized rocks to fellow rioters. These
16 rocks were then thrown at the police officers who were trying to contain the rioters. The
17 defendant then threw a large rock and struck Seattle Police Department Officer Michelle
18 Gallegos in the left knee and cracked her patella. The defendant was arrested a short time later
19 after a short chase.

20 Given the defendant's extremely assaultive conduct toward law enforcement, as well as
21 the fact that he was encouraging the use of potentially deadly force by handing out rocks to
22 others, substantial bail is appropriate. As a result, the State respectfully requests that the Court
23 impose bail in the amount of \$60,000, as well as issue an order which prohibits the defendant
24 from having any contact with the victim or witnesses in this matter. This amount of bail is
consistent with that which was imposed at the investigation hearing.

There is probable cause to believe that Joshua Conan Wollstein committed the crime(s) of Riot and Assault within the City of Seattle, County of King, State of Washington.

This belief is predicated on the following facts and circumstances:

This incident occurred at 1628 5th Avenue within the city limits of Seattle in King County, Washington on May 1 2013 at about 2010 hours.

This incident is part of the larger May Day riot in Seattle on May 1, 2013. The May Day demonstrations had two components: the peaceful, non-violent demonstrators that marched during the day, and the non-peaceful, violent demonstrators that began marching in the evening hours from the Capitol Hill area to downtown area of Seattle.

Seattle Police detectives Hall and Young were involved in monitoring the non-peaceful demonstrators as they marched from Capitol Hill to the downtown area. Detective Young described the scene. "The crowd of about 200 people stopped marching and blocked the streets around Westlake Park in downtown Seattle. At that point they became hostile and arrests were being made for people throwing objects at the police. After each arrest the crowd became more angry and would surround the police and try to obstruct the arrest."

Detective Hall, an expert in the anarchist movement, described some members of the crowd. "I had observed that members of the crowd, many in 'Black Bloc anarchist' style clothing, were throwing water bottles, clear bags with an unknown liquid and large solid objects at uniformed Seattle Police Officers located within the crowd, mid-block on Live Street. Black Bloc anarchist style clothing is typified by all black clothing with a black bandanna or black balaclava concealing the individual's face. There were also ignited smoke devices being held by individuals in Black Bloc attire. The rhetoric and actions of the crowd were escalating in violence toward the uniformed Seattle Police Officers. Detectives Hall and Young both observed suspect Wollstein's actions.

Joshua Wollstein wore Black Bloc anarchist style clothing. He was wearing a black baseball cap turned backwards, sunglasses, dark bandanna with a dark jacket, a jacket that had red paint splotches on it, dark backpack and dark pants. Detective Hall watched Wollstein as he ran to a City of Seattle trash can located at the southeast corner of 5th Avenue and Olive Street. Wollstein turned over the trash can, spilling the contents into the street. He rummaged around in the spilled trash and removed an empty 12 ounce green bottle. He threw it at the uniformed Seattle Police officers. He returned to the trash, rummaged around in it again, and picked up another green bottle from the trash. From the middle of the street he threw this second bottle at the uniformed Seattle Police Officers. Detective Young also saw Wollstein throw the bottles at the uniformed Seattle Police Officers. Neither detective were able to see if the bottles struck any officers, but they heard on the police radio that officers were being repeatedly struck by thrown bottles.

Detective Young followed Wollstein. Detective Hall did so as well. Detective Hall tried to call for uniformed officers to assist in arresting Wollstein, but was unable to reach anyone on his radio. He decided to arrest Wollstein himself.

When Detective Hall identified himself to Wollstein, Wollstein tried to get away. Wollstein tried to pull free from Detective Hall's grasp on his wrist. In the struggle he struck Detective Hall in the shin, causing pain and bleeding. Bicycle Officer Jokela assisted in arresting Wollstein. Officer Jokela searched Wollstein incident to arrest and found a lead loaded leather sap, otherwise known as a sand club, in his back pocket.

At the precinct Detective Young advised Wollstein of his Miranda rights. Wollstein said he understood his rights. He said he was "speaking out" about his family not having enough to eat and other injustices. When Detective Young asked him if he threw a bottle in the crowd, Wollstein asked for an attorney.

FBI Agent Maron saw and took photographs of Wollstein throwing the bottles at the uniformed Seattle Police Officers. During this riot, several Seattle Police Officers were injured by thrown objects.







This belief is predicated on the following facts and circumstances:

Officer Ricardo Martinez was working the May Day disturbance as a bicycle officer. He was near 4th and Stewart St.

Officers were arresting a subject unrelated to this event; Officer Martinez and other officers were encircling the other officers to protect them from the crowd, and were using their bicycles to do so, when Miller attempted to get between the officers and at the arrest. When Martinez stopped Miller, Miller swung his fist, striking Martinez in the shoulder. The officers grabbed him and he resisted their attempts to arrest him, but was taken to the ground and into custody.

I pulled up Miller's booking photograph. When I saw his face, I recognized it from video I had watched this morning of the May Day riot. I again pulled up the video on a Fox News site, which was part of "The O'Reilly Factor". They were showing video from KIRO TV of the riot. I found the clip that showed a close-up view of a person who is clearly recognizable as Miller, trying to get past the officers, assaulting an officer as Martinez had described in his report, and being pulled to the ground and arrested.

I captured two still shots from the online video. One shows the clearly recognizable Miller facing off against officers. The other is a clip taken from when he struck Officer Martinez. The capture is blurred, but the viewer can make out what is occurring.

The actual video was ordered from KIRO, who agreed to provide it, and will be available soon.







That Al Cruise is a Detective with the Seattle Police Department (SPD) and has reviewed the investigation conducted in Seattle Police Department Case Number 13-146026;

There is probable cause to believe that Gerardo Arturo Hernandez dob/01-23-1995 committed the crime (s) of Assault.

This belief is predicated on the following facts and circumstances:

On 05-01-2013, there were several protests demonstrations occurring in downtown Seattle. One of the demonstrations became unruly and property damage was occurring as well as assaults on officers and citizens. SPD **Officer Ryan Ellis** was on duty assigned to this event. He was in full uniform (Bike Officer Uniform). While working a crowd control line, a demonstrator threw a glass bottle at the officers, striking Officer Ellis on the leg. Officer Ellis complained of pain and observed redness at the impact site. At time of occurrence, the suspect was clearly visible and identifiable by officers. Initially it was unsafe to attempt to arrest the suspect. A short while later Officers Ellis and Feldman observed the suspect and placed him under arrest after a short bicycle versus pedestrian pursuit. The method of identification was direct, first person identification by the victim officer.

The assault was witnessed by numerous officers including fellow SPD **Officer Henry J. Feldman #7548**. Officer Feldman wrote the following statement/report:

On 05/01/2013 hours I was working uniform bicycle patrol as unit 2U86. I was working in the downtown Seattle area on a bicycle with the North Precinct Bike Squad for the May Day event. Victim/Officer Ellis submitted the following statement:

On 05/01/13, I was working uniform patrol as 2U87, as a member of the North Precinct Bike squad, assigned to the East precinct for the May Day protest. During my duties, I provided crowd control near the intersection of the 400 block Olive WY, during which time I was on the front line, moving Eastbound on Olive WY. At this location, I observed a Black male suspect, wearing red shorts and a grey long sleeve tee shirt throw what appeared to be a glass bottle, striking me in the leg, below the left knee. I experienced slight pain and redness to my left leg. The black male suspect then disappeared within the crowd.

*At approximately 2040 hours, I was moving eastbound on Pike ST. During this time, I observed the same black male suspect walking eastbound on Pike ST, near Minor AV. As officers attempted to contact the suspect, the suspect started running away from officers. The suspect was then taken into custody by Ofc. Feldmann. The suspect was identified as Hernandez, Gerardo A, DOB: 01-23-95.
End of statement.*

There is no information to indicate that this suspect was contained by the officers in any way. As part of standard crowd management strategies, an escape / retreat route was available to the suspect. **THE INFORMATION IN THIS CASE INDICATES THE SUSPECT THREW A GLASS BOTTLE AT A LINE OF UNIFORMED POLICE OFFICERS.**


