The undersigned on oath states:

2.1 I am a Special Deputy Prosecuting Attorney for this county:

2.2 I am familiar with the investigative report prepared in this matter and the following information is contained in that report:

On April 13, 2013, within the boundaries of Mason County, Washington, Deputy Severance, of the Mason County Sheriff's Office, responded to the report of a Burglary that had occurred within the jurisdiction. Upon arrival, the deputy contacted the

1 homeowners, Michael and Charity Dorcy, who indicated that their house had been
2 entered without permission and Ms. Dorcy's pain medication had been taken. The
3 Dorcys identified the perpetrator as Emily Rose Worf, the defendant herein.


4 Mr. Dorcy indicated that his family had known the defendant for a period of time
5 and, in fact, was employed in his office. On occasion, the defendant had been in the
6 Dorcy home with permission, but her entry on April 13, 2013 was without permission.
7 Mr. Dorcy indicated that he began to get suspicious of the defendant because she
8 would text both him and Ms. Dorcy to ask their whereabouts. Ms. Dorcy checked her
9 prescription for Vicodin and discovered that 82 pills were missing from the prescription
10 that she had not taken. In fact, Ms. Dorcy inventoried her Vicodin pills on April 9, 2013.
11 At that time, 18 pills remained and she had not taken any since the inventory.
12 Concerned, Mr. Dorcy set up a remote camera to catch any thefts of the prescription
13 medication.

14 On April 13, 2013, both Dorcys received texts from the defendant inquiring into
15 their location. Both indicated to the defendant that they were not home. At
16 approximately 1343 hours, the camera detected motion and began photographing. The
17 person in the photographs was positively identified as the defendant herein. She can be
18 seen entering the cabinet where the medication was stored. A neighbor, aware of the
19 circumstances, recorded the license plate number of the vehicle in front of the Dorcy
20 residence. The vehicle returned as registered at the time to the defendant. Another
21 inventory was taken and two Vicodin pills were missing.


22 The defendant was contacted wearing the same clothes as observed in the
23 surveillance photographs and was arrested. The defendant turned over one Vicodin pill
24 and, post-Miranda, admitted to entering the home without permission and admitted to
25 taking one Vicodin.

26 The defendant has no criminal history. The state believes probable cause exists
27 for the charge of Residential Burglary and VUCSA-Possession (Vicodin). The state
28 requests that the defendant be held on condition of release pending trial in this matter.

1 Based on the above, the State requests that the suspect, EMILY ROSE WOLF,
2 be detained subject to conditions of release.
