DECLARATION OF PROBABLE CAUSE

Case Number:13-04402

Probable cause exists for the charging and/or arrest and/or detention of the defendant based on the following fact and circumstances:

Emily Rose Worf (091191) violated RCW 9A.52.030; Burglary 2nd Degree, and RCW 69.50.4013; Possession of a Controlled Substance by entering the residence unlawfully at 171 SE Shadowood Dr and taking 2 Vicodin pills belonging to the victim.

On 041313 at 1534 hours, I was advised of a reported burglary at 171 SE Shadowood Rd. I responded and contacted the Complainant, Michael Dorcy, who stated he had evidence that Emily had entered the residence today and taken pills prescribed to his wife, Charity Dorcy.

I interviewed Michael and Charity who told me they have been associated with Emily and helping her out for some time. Charity has house sat for them in the past and has been given permission in the past to go the house when the Dorcy's are not home. She did not have permission recently or today, 041313. The Dorcy's have a keypad lock on their door that only the Dorcy's, their son, and Emily have the code to access. Emily is currently an employee of Michael's.

Michael told me he began having suspicions that Emily might be stealing pills from Charity. He stated that they both often get independent text messages asking where they are or if they are home. Charity checked her prescription of Vicodin and found that there were 82 pills missing that she had not taken. She was also missing some of her Tramadol. On 040913, Charity inventoried her pills and had 18 vicodin pills. She has not taken any since.

Due to his suspicions, Michael set up a remote camera on his laptop to watch the cabinet where Charity stores her medications. Today, on 041313, Michael and Charity were at home when they both received text messages from Emily, wondering where they were. Charity told Emily she was going to town and Michael told her he was at the office. Michael activated the camera and they left.

At 1343 hours, the camera detected motion and began photographing. The series of photos shows a thin blonde female in a red sweatshirt enter the kitchen, open the cabinet where the Vicodin is stored. The female removed items from the cabinet. The camera angle prevented the photos from showing exactly what was removed from the cabinet. The female closed the cabinet and opened the fridge and then turned to the camera, showing her face. Michael told me he recognized the female as Emily. I later compared the photo to Emily's DOL photo and positively identified her as the female in the photo.

Charity told me that she had asked her neighbor, Cliff Flores to watch her residence for a black pickup truck. At 1345 hours, Cliff noticed a Black Toyota pickup in the driveway and recorded the license plate number, Wa #B99606P. The vehicle is registered to Emily and Kerry Worf.

I obtained a recorded statement from Michael and Charity. Michael also provided me with a CD containing the surveillance photos. I left the residence and attempted to contact Emily at 829 W Franklin St, where she has been staying. I was unable to contact her so I provided the suspect information to Shelton police in an effort to find her.

Later in the evening, I was contacted by Sgt. Fiola of the Shelton Police who

had located Emily at 829 W Franklin St. Sgt. Fiola provided me with a white pill handed to him by Emily when he contacted her. I assumed control of Emily and released the City officers. Emily was wearing the same clothes that she had on during the burglary. I advised Emily of her Miranda Warnings and right to counsel which she waived. She provided me with a recorded statement, admitting to entering the Dorcy residence today and taking one vicodin, the one she returned. She stated she has had permission in the past to enter the residence and had the code to the door. I asked if she had permission to enter the residence today, she said no.

I took Emily into custody and booked her into the Mason County Jail for Burglary 2nd Degree and Possession of a Controlled Substance. I placed the single vicodin pill, the photo CD and the statements into evidence.


