## Summons:

### Notice about Petition to Modify Child Support Order

To: Jason Michael Ford and Kirsten Michelle Harris

The State of Washington is asking the court to modify the *Child Support Order*.  
You must respond in writing for the court to consider your side.

**Deadline!** Your *Response* must be served on the other party within **20 days** of the date you were served this *Summons* (60 days if you were served outside of Washington State). If the case has been filed, you must also file your *Response* by the same deadline. If you do not file and serve your *Response* or a *Notice of Appearance* by the deadline:

- No one has to notify you about other hearings in this case, and
- The court may approve the requests in the *Petition* without hearing your side (called a *default judgment*).

Follow these steps:

1. **Read** the *Petition* and any other documents you receive with this *Summons*. These documents explain what the other party is asking for.

**2. Fill out** the *Response to Petition to Modify a Child Support Order* (form FL Modify 502). You can get the *Response* and other forms at:

- The Administrative Office of the Courts - call: (360) 705-5328,
- Washington LawHelp: [www.washingtonlawhelp.org](http://www.washingtonlawhelp.org), or
- The Superior Court Clerk's office or county law library (for a fee).

**3. Serve** (give) a copy of your *Response* to the person who filed this *Summons* at the address below and to any other parties. You may use certified mail with return receipt requested. For more information on how to serve, read Superior Court Rule 5.

**4. File** your original *Response* with the court clerk at this address:

If there is no "Case No." listed on page 1, this case may not have been filed and you will not be able to file a *Response*. Contact the Superior Court Clerk or check [www.courts.wa.gov](http://www.courts.wa.gov) to find out.

If the case was **not** filed, you must still serve your *Response*, and you may demand that the other party file this case with the court. Your demand must be in writing and must be served on the other party or his/her lawyer (whoever signed this *Summons*). If the other party does not file papers for this case within 14 days of being served with your demand, this service on you of the *Summons and Petition* will not be valid. If the other party does file, then you must file your original *Response* with the court clerk at the address above.

**5. Lawyer not required:** It's a good idea to talk to a lawyer, but you may file and serve your *Response* without one.
