Robert Kurtz, as indicated by NJ family services, is a security guard, with no case worker or case management status. The Brooklawn NJ police dept log, which there was no official report or investigation filed for, does not support his declaration. There is no open case with family services divisions, nor pending case, in any state, including NJ, WA, CO, WY and OR. Oregon opened a case briefly to fulfill the ex parte order only. 
We fled the home several times as victims of domestic abuse, the last time being November 18, 2020. We sought, and were granted, a final protection order Dec. 17, 2020. That included the children. We were accepted into the domestic violence shelter system 12/5/2020 - 1/16/2021. We have been living between Lacey, WA and Portland, OR, with friends and community advocates since, to date. Yes, we have an RV and van. The Oakridge police officer noted we had everything we needed, the RV didn't leak, was warm and dry, working. We had food, water, cooking facilities and bathroom. Marylou White and others were helping me with Hazel, including her schooling. I've been seeing Linda Sisson, a certified counselor, since Dec 2020. There is no immediate danger or threat. Hans is NOT the grandfather. The claims are false and misrepresented.

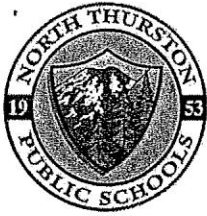

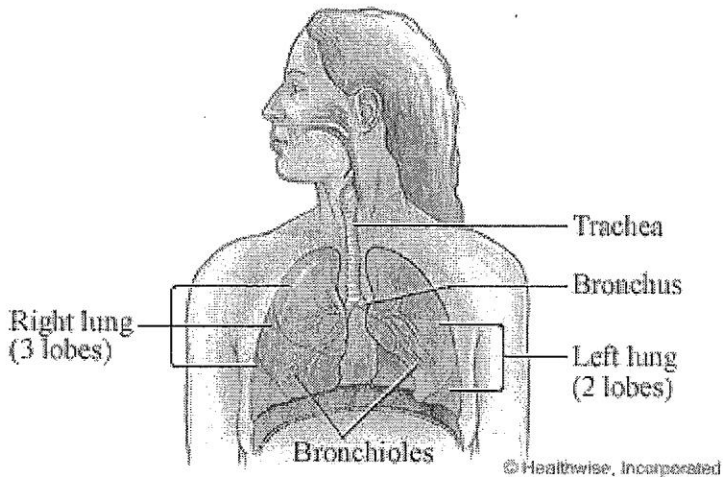

Pneumonia: Care Instructions

Your Care Instructions



Pneumonia is an infection of the lungs. Most cases are caused by infections from bacteria or viruses.

Pneumonia may be mild or very severe. If it is caused by bacteria, you will be treated with antibiotics. It may take a few weeks to a few months to recover fully from pneumonia, depending on how sick you were and whether your overall health is good.

Follow-up care is a key part of your treatment and safety. Be sure to make and go to all appointments, and call your doctor if you are having problems. It's also a good idea to know your test results and keep a list of the medicines you take.

How can you care for yourself at home?

- Take your antibiotics exactly as directed. Do not stop taking the medicine just because you are feeling better. You need to take the full course of antibiotics.
- Take your medicines exactly as prescribed. Call your doctor if you think you are having a problem with your medicine.
- Get plenty of rest and sleep. You may feel weak and tired for a while, but your energy level will improve with time.
- To prevent dehydration, drink plenty of fluids, enough so that your urine is light yellow or clear like water. Choose water and other caffeine-free clear liquids until you feel better. If you have kidney, heart, or liver disease and have to limit fluids, talk with your doctor before you increase the amount of fluids you drink.
- Take care of your cough so you can rest. A cough that brings up mucus from your lungs is common with pneumonia. It is one way your body gets rid of the infection. But if coughing keeps you from resting or causes severe fatigue and chest-wall pain, talk to your doctor. He or she may suggest that you take a medicine to reduce the cough.
- Use a vaporizer or humidifier to add moisture to your bedroom. Follow the directions for cleaning the machine.
- Do not smoke or allow others to smoke around you. Smoke will make your cough last longer. If you need help quitting, talk to your doctor about stop-smoking programs and medicines. These can increase your chances of quitting for good.

- Take an over-the-counter pain medicine, such as acetaminophen (Tylenol), ibuprofen (Advil, Motrin), or naproxen (Aleve). Read and follow all instructions on the label.
- Do not take two or more pain medicines at the same time unless the doctor told you to. Many pain medicines have acetaminophen, which is Tylenol. Too much acetaminophen (Tylenol) can be harmful.
- If you were given a spirometer to measure how well your lungs are working, use it as instructed. This can help your doctor tell how your recovery is going.
- To prevent pneumonia in the future, talk to your doctor about getting a flu vaccine (once a year) and a pneumococcal vaccine (one time only for most people).

When should you call for help?



Call 911 anytime you think you may need emergency care. For example, call if:

- You have severe trouble breathing.

Call your doctor now or seek immediate medical care if:

- You cough up dark brown or bloody mucus (sputum).
- You have new or worse trouble breathing.
- You are dizzy or lightheaded, or you feel like you may faint.

Watch closely for changes in your health, and be sure to contact your doctor if:

- You have a new or higher fever.
- You are coughing more deeply or more often.
- You are not getting better after 2 days (48 hours).
- You do not get better as expected.

Your Body's Response to Anxiety

Normal anxiety is part of the body's natural defense system. It's an alert to a threat that is unknown, vague, or comes from your own internal fears. While you're in this state, your feelings can range from a vague sense of worry to physical sensations such as a pounding heartbeat. These feelings make you want to react to the threat. An anxiety response is normal in many situations. But when you have an anxiety disorder, the same response can occur at the wrong times.

Anxiety can be helpful

Normal anxiety is a signal from your brain. It warns you of a threat. It's a normal response to help you prevent something. Or to decrease the bad effects of something you can't control. For example, anxiety is a normal response to situations that might harm your body, separate you from a loved one, or lose your job. The symptoms of anxiety can be physical and mental.

How does it feel?

People with anxiety may have:

- Dizziness
- Muscle tension or pain
- Restlessness
- Sleeplessness
- Trouble focusing
- Racing heartbeat
- Fast breathing
- Shaking or trembling
- Stomachache
- Diarrhea
- Loss of energy
- Sweating
- Cold, clammy hands
- Chest pain
- Dry mouth

Anxiety can also be a problem

Anxiety can become a problem when it is hard to control, occurs for months, and interferes with important parts of your life. With an anxiety disorder, your body has the response described above, but in inappropriate ways. The response a person has depends on the anxiety disorder he or she has. With some disorders, the anxiety is way out of proportion to the threat that triggers it. With others, anxiety may occur even when there isn't a clear threat or trigger.

Who does it affect?

Some people are more likely to have lasting anxiety than others. It tends to run in families. And it affects more younger people than older people, and more women than men. But no age, race, or gender is immune to anxiety problems.

Anxiety can be treated

The good news is that the anxiety that's disrupting your life can be treated. Check with your healthcare provider and rule out any physical problems that may be causing the anxiety symptoms. If an anxiety disorder is diagnosed, seek mental healthcare. This is an illness and it can respond to treatment. Most types of anxiety disorders will respond to talk therapy (counseling) and medicines. Working with your doctor or other healthcare provider, you can develop skills to help you cope with anxiety. You can also gain the perspective you need to overcome your fears. Good sources of support or guidance can be found at your local hospital, mental health clinic, or an employee assistance program.



How to cope with anxiety

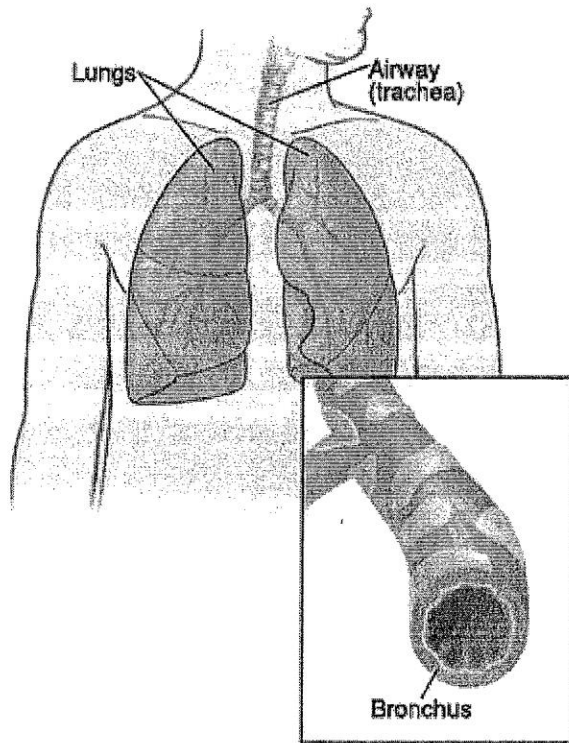
Here are some things you can do to cope:

- **Do what you can.** Keep in mind that you can't control everything. Change what you can. And let the rest take its course.
- **Exercise.** This is a great way to ease tension and help your body feel relaxed.
- **Stay away from caffeine and nicotine.** These can make anxiety symptoms worse.
- **Stay sober.** Don't use alcohol or unprescribed medicines. They only make things worse in the long run.
- **Learn more about anxiety disorders.** Keep track of helpful online resources and books you can use during stressful periods.
- **Try stress management.** Try methods such as meditation.
- **Talk with others.** Think about joining online or in-person support groups.
- **Get help.** Find professional mental health services if your symptoms can't be managed or reduced with the above methods.

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Viral Bronchitis (Adult)



You have a viral bronchitis. Bronchitis is inflammation and swelling of the lining of the lungs. This is often caused by an infection. Symptoms include a dry, hacking cough that is worse at night. The cough may bring up yellow-green mucus. You may also feel short of breath or wheeze. Other symptoms may include tiredness, chest discomfort, and chills.

Bronchitis that is caused by a virus is not treated with antibiotics. Instead, medicines may be given to help relieve symptoms. Symptoms can last up to 2 weeks, although the cough may last much longer.

This illness is contagious during the first few days and is spread through the air by coughing and sneezing, or by direct contact (touching the sick person and then touching your own eyes, nose, or mouth).

Most viral illnesses resolve within 10 to 14 days with rest and simple home remedies, although they may sometimes last for several weeks.

Home care

- If symptoms are severe, rest at home for the first 2 to 3 days. When you go back to your usual activities, don't let yourself get too tired.
- Do not smoke. Also avoid being exposed to secondhand smoke.
- You may use over-the-counter medicine to control fever or pain, unless another pain medicine was prescribed. If you have chronic liver or kidney disease or have ever had a stomach ulcer or gastrointestinal bleeding, talk with your healthcare provider before using these medicines. Also talk to your provider if you are taking medicine to prevent blood clots. Aspirin should never be given to anyone younger than 18 years of age who is ill with a viral infection or fever. It may cause severe liver or brain damage.
- Your appetite may be poor, so a light diet is fine. Avoid dehydration by drinking 6 to 8 glasses of fluids per day (such as water, soft drinks, sports drinks, juices, tea, or soup). Extra fluids will help loosen secretions in the nose and lungs.
- Over-the-counter cough, cold, and sore-throat medicines will not shorten the length of the illness, but they may help to reduce symptoms. Don't use decongestants if you have high blood pressure.

Follow-up care

Follow up with your healthcare provider, or as advised. If you had an X-ray or ECG (electrocardiogram), a specialist will review it. You will be notified of any new findings that may affect your care.

If you are age 65 or older, or if you have a chronic lung disease or condition that affects your immune system, or you smoke, ask your healthcare provider about getting a pneumococcal vaccine and a yearly flu shot (influenza vaccine).

When to seek medical advice

Call your healthcare provider right away if any of these occur:

- Fever of 100.4°F (38°C) or higher, or as directed by your healthcare provider
- Coughing up increased amounts of colored sputum
- Weakness, drowsiness, headache, facial pain, ear pain, or a stiff neck

Call 911

Call 911 if any of these occur:

- Coughing up blood

It is further ordered that the clerk of the court shall forward a copy of this order on or before the next judicial day to the law enforcement agency WHERE PETITIONER LIVES (as set forth on page 1), which shall enter it into WACIC.

- Respondent appeared and received notice of this order; no further service required.

2. Instructions for how to attend your virtual hearing via Zoom Meetings

You will need the Zoom Meeting ID number for the hearing. The Zoom Meeting ID for your hearing can be found in section 1 at the beginning of these instructions or the notice of hearing.

- Once you have joined you will enter the virtual waiting room. Before the start of your hearing, the judicial officer will admit you into the virtual hearing. However, if you have not been admitted for more than 10 minutes after the calendar start time, please confirm you have the correct zoom meeting ID.

Considerations for Virtual Hearings:

Virtual hearings are just like attending court in person.

Who can attend:

- Witnesses may be placed in a separate location until it is time for their testimony.
- No one may speak during the hearing unless requested to do so by the judicial officer; no one present with you as a support can tell you what to say to the court.

Required:

- Everyone must dress appropriately and act respectfully during the time they will spend in the virtual courtroom;
- Mute your microphone unless you are asked to speak;
- Follow judicial officer's stated rules or you may be removed from the hearing;

- Close out other applications and create distance from other devices to avoid interference with reception;
- Login five minutes prior to your hearing start time.
