

I will address the effect on the children first: Hazel is autistic, and Onawa is developmentally delayed in speech. Both children were confused, terrified, and upset when their mother used them as a shield to prevent law enforcement from separating them from her. Hazel could not process what was happening and began to go into an autistic meltdown which exacerbated Onawa's sobbing & attempts to free herself from her mother's grip. Even after the police were able to get the children away from Selena and return them to inside our home, it took hours to calm them down. Hazel had bruises on her arms & Onawa had scrapes up her back from being rolled on during the struggle.

It seemed to me that Selena wanted to make a statement concerning the guardianship of her children rather than any actual concern for how the children would respond.

I was shocked to see Selena turn up unannounced and walk into our house as no visitation had been set up by the court. She was not invited in & simply aggressively walked in the door. First she declared that she had come to visit the children followed by the declaration (made several times) that she would not be leaving without the children so therefore we would have to call the police & have her arrested. It is an though she expected us to let her leave with the children. So, I called the police. While still in the residence she was argumentative & began calling us names.

Subsequently, we remain apprehensive that her behavior will escalate even further. We have become fearful to the point that we lock all the doors when we go out even when gardening in the from yard. The children run to the front windows whenever the dog barks to see who has arrived, not with anticipation.
