1 NOTICE: State and federal law provide protections to defendants who are in the military  
2 service, and to their dependents. Dependents of a service member are the service member's  
3 spouse, the service member's minor child, or an individual for whom the service member  
4 provided more than one-half of the individual's support for one hundred eighty days  
5 immediately preceding an application for relief.

6 One protection provided is the protection against the entry of a default judgment in certain  
7 circumstances. This notice pertains only to a defendant who is a dependent of a member of the  
8 national guard or a military reserve component under a call to active service, or a national guard  
9 member under a call to service authorized by the governor of the state of Washington, for a  
10 period of more than thirty consecutive days. Other defendants in military service also have  
11 protections against default judgments not covered by this notice. If you are the dependent of a  
12 member of the national guard or a military reserve component under a call to active service for  
13 a period of more than thirty consecutive days, you should notify the plaintiff or the plaintiff's  
14 attorneys in writing of your status as such within twenty days of the receipt of this notice. If you  
15 fail to do so, then a court or an administrative tribunal may presume that you are not a  
16 dependent of an active duty member of the national guard or reserves, or a national guard  
17 member under a call to service authorized by the governor of the state of Washington, and  
18 proceed with the entry of an order of default and/or a default judgment without further proof of  
19 your status. Your response to the plaintiff or plaintiff's attorneys about your status does not  
20 constitute an appearance for jurisdictional purposes in any pending litigation nor a waiver of  
21 your rights. RCW 38.42.050.
